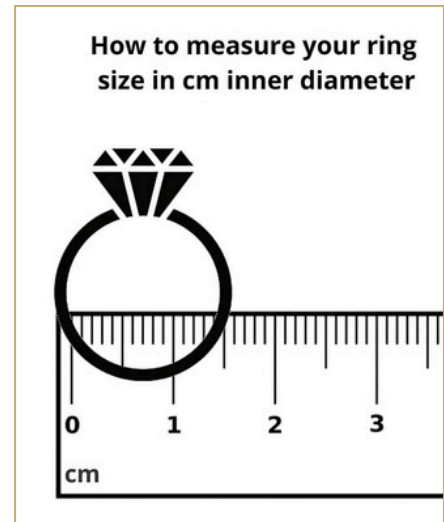


How To Measure Your Ring Size

There are a few different methods you can use to find out your perfect ring size. If you already own a ring in the correct size, you can physically measure it. If not, you can measure your finger to determine your size. Discover how to measure your ring size below.

Method 1 - Measure a Ring

Find a ring that fits comfortably on the finger you intend to wear your new ring on. Measure the internal diameter of the ring, using a ruler or measuring tape. To do so, ensure you are using a ruler with millimetre (mm) measurements, then place your ring on top of the ruler and measure the inside of the circle – in other words, the part that is in contact with your finger. You can use our Ring Size Chart to convert your diameter measurement into the closest Australian ring size.



Method 2: Measure your Finger/ The String Trick

Step 1: Use Non-Stretchy Material

Dental floss, baker's twine, or even a thin strip of paper works. Avoid materials that stretch (like yarn) for accuracy.



Step 2: Wrap and Measure

Loop the string around your finger, mark where it overlaps, and measure the length. Compare this to a Ring Size chart.

Pro Tip :

Knuckle Check: If your knuckle is significantly larger than your finger base, measure both and choose a size between the two.

Always double-check your measurements for accuracy. Your finger size can fluctuate slightly during the day, over time, and depending on the temperature. If measuring your actual finger, do so in the afternoon when your hands are warm for best results. If you fall between two ring sizes, choose the larger size (or half size) to ensure a comfortable fit. Ensure you measure the exact finger on which you intend to wear your ring (or a ring that you wear on the same finger). Your ring size will vary between your fingers as well as between your hands.

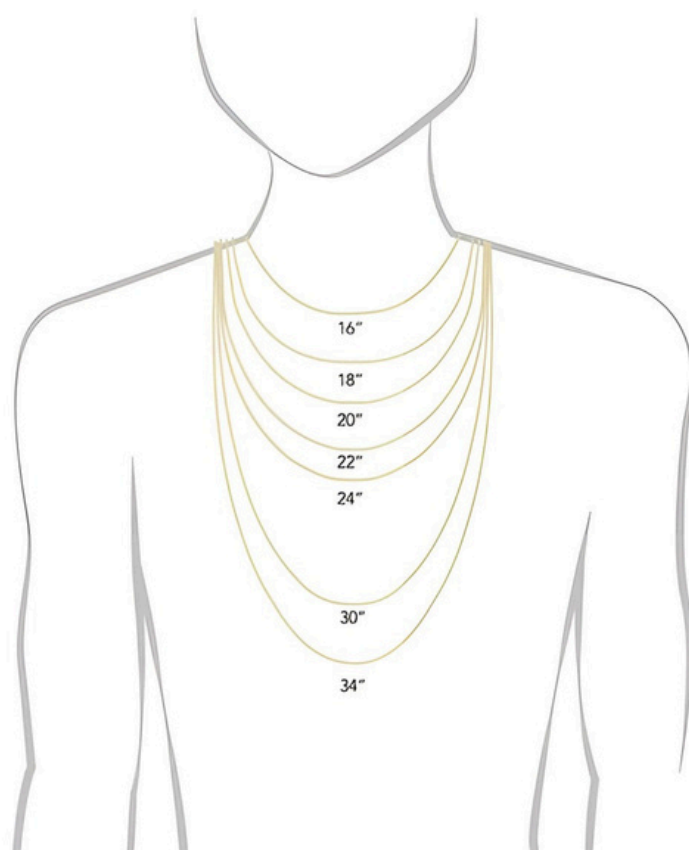

Chain & Necklace Length Guide

How to Choose the Right Chain Length

The most popular chain and necklace lengths vary from 40cm to 60cm. The right length for you depends on your personal style and where you would like your necklace to sit. A 40cm chain will generally sit at the base of your neck or just above your collarbone, whereas a 60cm chain will have a longer drop to around mid-chest. Use the below image as an approximate guide to how different chain lengths will look. If you're styling a layered necklace look, ensure you wear chains in different lengths so that each layer can be seen, and to create a trending tiered look.



Bracelets & Bangles Size Guide

How to Find Out Your Bracelet Size

Similar to choosing your ring size, you can determine your correct bangle or bracelet size by measuring your wrist or hand. For a bracelet, which opens and fastens around your wrist, measure the wrist itself. For a bangle, which is a rigid style generally designed to slip on, you'll need to allow some extra space.



Measure your wrist

Cut a piece of string or paper to a length of around 20 - 25cm. Wrap the string around your wrist, just above your wrist bone. Pull until it sits comfortably - not too tight, but not so loose that it could slip over your hand. Personal preference will also come into play here, depending whether you want a closer fit or a loose fit to be slung low over your hand. Use a pen to mark the overlapping parts of the string or paper. Lay the string/paper out flat against a ruler or tape measure, and measure between the end of the string and the point you have marked. This measurement provides your wrist circumference.

Please note, if you're measuring for a bangle which is designed to slip on and doesn't feature a hinge to open and close, you'll need to allow a little extra space for your bangle to slip over your hand.
